



1861 census - 48 Park Street, Bromley by Bow, Middlesex William (sic) Wiseman, head, married, 24, labourer, Sible Hedingham Susan Wiseman, wife, married, 20, Sible Hedingham Infant, son, 1 month, Bromley Middlesex

- .. this entry has two anomalies that make this doubtful but no other entry has as many similarities (location, places of birth, ages, Susan's name) and no other family has been found that fits this profile; such anomalies are not uncommon in census returns of this vintage:
 - .. John has been listed as William
- .. the infant here is assumed to be Alfred but by this time would have been about 12 months old and not a newborn

In 1861 Stratford was the economic centre of this part of Middlesex and Essex. Note that Stratford le Bow was in Middlesex and Stratford Marsh was in Essex, the River lea flowing under Bow Bridge being the boundary between the two counties.

	Name: REED, WILLIAM HENRY Mother's Maiden Surname: - (not given) GRO Reference: 1862 S Quarter in SAINT MARY MAGDALEN BERMONDSEY SURREY Volume 01D Page 58. Born at 43 1/2 West Street, Bermondsey. Registered a month later at Saint James, Surrey. Illegitimate; no father on birth registry. Note: St James is a sub-division of the St Mary Magdalen Registration district. There is nothing to suggest that John Wiseman had any further involvement with Mary or his son, William. Being a potential mother, Mary would have been no longer employed by the Gellatly family. With no residence it would usual for her to approach her nearest relative for shelter and this was her sister who lived in Bermondsey, just a few miles away on the south side of the River Thames. The journey would have been easy in one of the many boats plying for hire on the Thames at the time - as described in Dickens' 'Our Mutual Friend'.
1871 census - Shepherd and Dog, West Street, Godmanchester, Huntingdonshire	Richard Gale, head, married, 32, carpenter, Yelling Huntingdonshire Emily Gale, wife, married, 30, Godmanchester William Gale, son, 8, scholar, Godmanchester Mary Reed, visitor, servant, 33, domestic servant cook, Godmanchester in other rooms on the same premises John Read, head, married, 75, retired labourer, Wyboston Elizabeth Read, wife, married, 74, Chawston Henry Read, grandson, 9, scholar, London Emily is the daughter of John Reed and the sister of Mary Reed Henry Read is William Henry Read (b1862 in Bermondsey), the son of Mary Reed
1873 - marriage	Mary Reed married Francis Wardman in Moor Monkton, Yorkshire. It is difficult to imagine how they met but the Great North Road links Yorkshire with Huntingdonshire and perhaps one or both of them were travelling on this road when they met.
1881 census - 5 Hind Street, Stockton on Tees	Francis Wardman, head, married, 39, labourer for the corporation, Thirsk Mary Wardman, wife, married, 43, Chawson Bedfordshire Wm Hy Reed, son, unmarried, 18, puddler in the ironworks, Bermondsey Michael Dunn, boarder, unmarried, 35, puddler in the ironworks, Houghton le Spring Co.Durham William was Francis' stepson but this is a relationship frequently ignored on census returns, particularly when potential illegitimacy was involved. This is the last reference seen for Mary.

25 May 1885 - marriage	Marriage of William Henry Reed to Margaret Moir in West Hartlepool. Margaret was seven months pregnant at this time.
